

Walk with Pride Program

The primary goal of The Salvation Army in Fort Bend County is to assist clients with emergency needs. The Salvation Army staff assesses the clients' needs and determine what types of assistance they are eligible to receive. We offer financial assistance with rent, electricity, gas and water, as well as food vouchers, depending on the situation. Transportation vouchers are provided as funds are available. We also encourage our clients to speak with partnering agencies.

The Salvation Army has a positive working relationship with the other social service agencies in Fort Bend County and frequently refers clients to others who can also offer them the assistance they need. Also, The Salvation Army is an active member of the Fort Bend Alliance. Housed in the United Way building in Stafford, The Salvation Army Social Services is funded in part by the United Way but relies heavily on individual donations for the majority of its budget.

The Salvaton Army is deeply woven into the fabric of Christmas. The Salvation Army Angel Tree program provides Christmas assistance to disadvantaged children and seniors. For Christmas 2007, The Salvation Army registered and distributed gifts to over 600 needy children and elderly in Fort Bend. To accomplish this, The Salvation Army depends of the generosity of individuals donors, corporations, civic organizations, service groups and religious organizations.

The Walk with Pride program instills a sense of dignity in needy children as they they back to school each year. The Salvation Army provides new shoes to children from low-income households at the beginning of each school year. Each year, we distribute shoes to over 200 children in Fort Bend County. The Walk with Pride program is a collaborative effort by The Salvation Army, Fort Bend County's Health and Human Services and Payless Shoe Source.
