

My Chief of Staff, Molly, organized a Bill Reading Group (BRG) that consists of staff from thirty legislator's offices. They meet monthly to study the major issues affecting our State and to prepare reports for the legislators. They schedule agencies, associations, and focus groups to speak to the BRG about current and emerging issues. This research really comes in handy when we address legislation on these matters.

Community outreach continues to be a focus of mine during the interim. Since returning home in July, our office has coordinated numerous speaking engagements and community forums. Some have been held with students at our local schools, church groups, and business organizations. I believe that accountability starts with accessibility so this time to interact is an important way for me to develop a stronger relationship with the folks I represent. This spring, we'll continue our community wide efforts and have a new program. We are hosting schools in Austin at the Capitol to come see firsthand where lawmakers gather. Our staff has been aiding schools to schedule tours and visits to museums and historical sites as well as having lunch on the Capitol lawn. 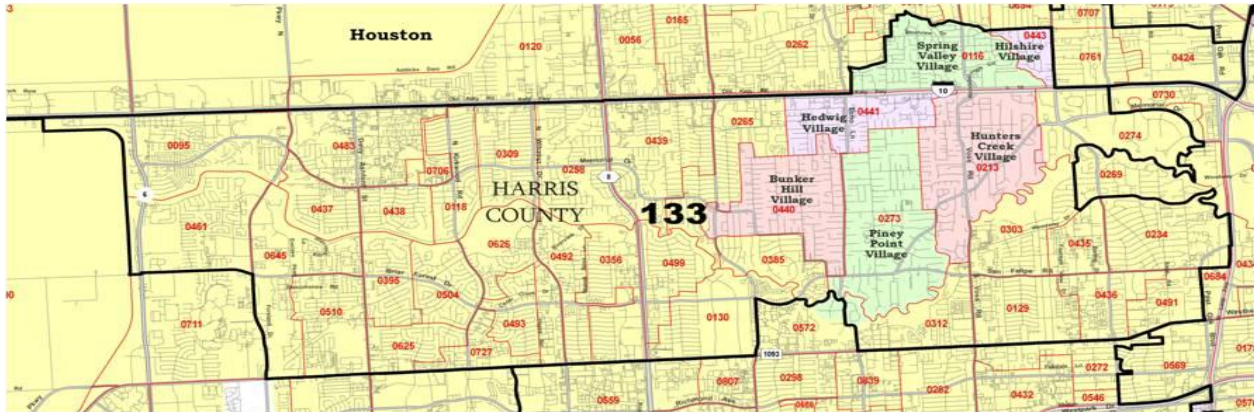
