Interim Studies

The Committees are preparing to begin their interim hearings. If you are interested in learning more about the [interim charges](#) or [committee hearings](#) please visit the House website or click on the links above. In the meantime, the Economic Development committee I sit on will be discussing the following seven charges this interim. Here is a sneak peek of our charges-

Did you know? Houston Edition-

- The total area of Houston is so large, it could contain the cities of New York, Boston, and San Francisco at the same time.
- If you love going to restaurants, Houston may be your city. Residents of Houston eat out more times a week than in any other city in America.
- Near the center of Houston, Interstates 45 and 10 intersect. This is almost the exact spot that Houston's founders, the Allen brothers, settled.

1. Review the statutes and state agency rules pertaining to public-private partnerships to ensure a fair, competitive, and transparent process that benefits all parties engaging in the partnership. Review how other states and countries utilize public-private partnerships and make recommendations on how to improve the process in Texas, specifically looking at whether there needs to be a single state entity responsible for administering the public private partnership program.
2. Examine and evaluate economic development incentives to determine if the incentives are achieving the desired outcomes for which the incentives were initially established. Review which economic development goals and incentives are most important and report on methods to further improve those goals and incentives while reducing ones not meeting their desired objectives.
3. Study venture capital investment in the state and determine how Texas compares to other states in attracting venture capital dollars. Make recommendations to improve Texas's ability in attract venture capital investment.
4. Review the current Texas Industry Cluster Initiative to determine if the state's targeted industry clusters need to be updated to reflect changes in industry sectors that have evolved in Texas since the clusters were initially identified.
5. Review the Governor's Office of Economic Development and Tourism and determine its effectiveness on economic development in Texas. Determine how the office could be more efficiently coordinated with local and regional economic development entities and other state agencies to help further the economic development goals of the state.
6. Monitor manufacturing and manufacturing workforce development initiatives passed by the 83rd Legislature.

7. Conduct legislative oversight and monitoring of the agencies and programs under the committee's jurisdiction and the implementation of relevant legislation passed by the 83rd Legislature.

In conducting this oversight, the committee should:

- a. consider any reforms to state agencies to make them more responsive to Texas taxpayers and citizens;
- b. identify issues regarding the agency or its governance that may be appropriate to investigate, improve, remedy, or eliminate;
- c. determine whether an agency is operating in a transparent and efficient manner; and
- d. identify opportunities to streamline programs and services while maintaining the mission of the agency and its programs.

This is a great time for you to share your thoughts on legislative ideas and get involved in the process. Please let us know if you have any ideas for legislation that would benefit our district and our state.

It's Tax Season!

The first day of spring and this year's vernal equinox is March 20, 2014. This puts us less than one month away from the Federal Income Tax filing deadline. We'd like to make sure that everyone in District 133 is aware of IRS Free File. This service, available through a partnership between the IRS and the tax software industry, provides free access to tax preparation software and step-by-step help in preparing and filing federal tax returns online. Through Free File, all taxpayers who made less than \$58,000 in 2013 can visit www.IRS.gov/freefile to prepare and e-file their federal tax returns. - TRASH BASH set for March 29, 2014- This is the 21st annual cleanup of the Galveston Bay Watershed. The event will be held on March 29, 2014 at 8:30 AM. Per the press release, this event started in 1993 with 7-sites and 3,000 volunteers. Now Trash Bash has grown to 16-sites across the Galveston Bay Watershed with more than 5,000 volunteers annually! In 2013 alone, 5,012 volunteers cleaned 167 miles of shoreline; collected 49 tons of trash; recycled 5,827 pounds of collected materials; and gathered 483 tires for recycling.
